Why Planned Giving:

Planned giving helps us budget and it helps you to support the ongoing work of this church even when you are unable to attend a regular service.

How it works:

If you sign up to the scheme you can give through weekly envelopes, a monthly standing order from your bank, or, new from this year, via a direct debit to the **Parish Giving Scheme**.

If you already give regularly, we encourage you to move to the Parish Giving Scheme, if you feel able, as this improves our cash flow and significantly decreases administration, releasing time and energy for other things.



We don't just do this on a Sunday morning, but 7 days a week, 52 weeks a year. See the back page for some of the exciting things we get up to from Monday to Saturday.


Growth:

Our church family has been blessed with our own good news of growth.

- Our church family has doubled in size in the last 4 years
- We now have a full time curate ministering with us.
- We are developing new leaders, with two lay leaders of worship completing their training and a reader in training.
- Children's church is flourishing and now regularly has 8-10 children on a Sunday

Mind the Gap

Our ministry here requires funding, and as we grow, so do our costs.

By 2022 we estimate that **our expenses will exceed our income by £16,400** even if we experience no further growth.

Our biggest cost, our Parish Share, is directly linked to the size of our worshipping community, but the impact of growth is fed in gradually over 5 years, so it will continue to rise even if our growth slows.

Generous giving

About 60% of our income comes from the regular monthly or weekly donations of the 80 people in our Planned Giving Scheme. A further 20% from other donations. To bridge our funding gap we need to encourage each person to play their part

Could you join our planned givers?

If we are to continue to flourish, we need members of the Church Family to give regularly — every little helps.

Could you give more?

Giving to our planned giving scheme ranges from £5 to over £300 per month

Our average giver gives £30 per month to church, but for the diocese as a whole average giving is £60 and for Bedfordshire alone is £50. Could we be better than average?
